#### "BOB NOTES..."

I have included a brief explanation of the main points of each book of the Bible during the past few months. So far, we have covered the books of the law (Genesis through Deuteronomy) and the first half of the books of history (Joshua through 2 Kings). This month, we come upon the second half of the historical books of the Old Testament—1 & 2 Chronicles, Ezra, Nehemiah, and Esther. Esther is probably the best known of these five books. Let's begin.

**1 & 2 Chronicles** are set in the same time period as 2 Samuel and 1 Kings. Basically, they give a report, a chronicle, of Judah from the time of King Saul's death up through the Babylonian captivity. They were composed much later then the books of the Kings. 1 Chronicles contains the most extensive collection of genealogy in the Bible. Written from the point of view of the priests, much emphasis is placed upon the dedication and services of the Temple under the ministry of the Levites. 2 Chronicles records several reformations, including the most extended period of revival in Bible history under the leadership of Hezekiah.

<u>Ezra</u> is set in the time period following the return of the Jews from exile in Persia. Beginning in 538 BC, the emphasis of the book is on the rebuilding of the Temple that had been destroyed when Judah was taken into exile. The book covers a period of about 100 years and includes the period of Ezra's ministry as well as statistics, numbers, and genealogies.

<u>Nehemiah</u> covers a period of 14 years and records the **last historical events of the Old Testament.** Everything else which comes after this in the Old Testament is connected with only the events described in the years of the first 18 books of the Bible. Nehemiah's time period ends **432 years before the birth of Jesus Christ**. The temple had been rebuilt by this time, but the walls of Jerusalem were still in ruins because of the apathy and laziness of the people. The book records eleven different incidences in which Nehemiah is engaged in prayer.

<u>Esther</u> closes out the books of history with events that occurred when the Jews were being held captive in Persia. Esther was a Jewish maiden who, as queen of Persia, was used to deliver her people from a planned massacre. The king was Xerxes (486-465 BC). The name of God is never mentioned in the book of Esther, nor is there any illusion in the book to the New Testament, but in no other portion of the Bible is God's providential care of God's people more evident than it is in the Book of Esther.

Next month, we will cover the books of wisdom and poetry. The material included in these books is among the most memorable in the Old Testament.

our series, WHAT IF...? on Sunday mornings October 15-29 where we'll be imagining what God would do through us if we would really trust Him with what He's already blessed us with.




