"Bob Notes..."

This month, we continue our look at basic information about the books of the Bible. As I mentioned a few months back, I have begun this process in an effort to help us to increase our knowledge of the Holy Scriptures. Last month, we covered the first five books of the Bible—the Law, or the Pentateuch. This month covers the books in the Old Testament that are classified as History.

The History included in these books of Joshua, Judges, Ruth, 1 & 2 Samuel, 1 & 2 Kings, 1 & 2 Chronicles, Ezra, Nehemiah, and Esther covers the period from the time that the people of Israel entered into the Promised Land following the death of Moses up until the early years after they had returned from the exile to Babylon and Persia. Scholars believe this history covers the almost 1,000 year period between 1406 and 432 BC.

In this September Echo article, I will include a brief overview of the first six (Joshua through 2 Kings) of these twelve books. Next month's issue will include 1 Chronicles through Esther.

Joshua—records in part the military campaigns waged by Joshua in conquering the Promised Land and concludes with detailed instructions for the division of the land among the tribes of Israel. It is the first book in the Bible to contain the name of its principle character in the title. With the people of Israel's' entry into the Promised Land, they should have been totally successful, but disobedience led to instances of defeat. Joshua is set in the thirty year period of 1406-1375 BC.

Judges—the theme of Judges is one of defeat and deliverance. Set during a three hundred year period from 1375-1075 BC, the book records the activities of twelve men and one woman designated as judges and raised up by God to deliver Israel in times of dissension and disunion after Joshua's death. Judges is a very violent book at times, and the cycle common in Israel's history of rebellion, retribution, repentance, and restoration occurs repeatedly throughout the book.

1 Samuel & 2 Samuel-First and Second Samuel are counted as one book in the Hebrew Bible. 1 Samuel records Samuel's life, the introduction of kings instead of judges as the rulers of the people, the life of Saul and David's anointing and early years. 2 Samuel picks up after the tragic death of Israel's' first king Saul. The book records David's military victories, his great sin, and his flight at the time of his son Absalom's revolt, as well as his return to Jerusalem. These two books cover a period of 130 years.

1 Kings & 2 Kings-First and Second Kings was also originally one book. They are called Books of the Kings because they record the principal events and characteristics of the kings of Judah and Israel from the death of David to the end of the kingdom of Judah and the fall of Jerusalem. They cover the 384 year period up until 586 BC. These books display in often stark terms the rebellion, retribution, repentance and restoration cycle. Famous individuals such as Solomon, Ahab, and Elijah are covered in these books.

This is the first part of the lengthy history included in the Old Testament. The history is important as it continues to lay the foundation of faith that would eventually lead to the coming of the Messiah.


