"Bob Notes..."

We take a break this month from my series on the books of the Bible to focus in on the holiday season that is before us.

As I am writing this article, it is about a week before Thanksgiving. But signs of Christmas abound. I was reminded when I went into Wal-Mart the day before this writing that it is only 39 days til Christmas—now 38, and probably somewhere in the twenties by the time you read this. The town of Rossville and many other municipalities have put up their decorations on utility poles. And, I have noticed many homes which already have their Christmas trees and outdoor displays up—such as the guy in Edna Mills with his antique car with the Frosty and Santa in the front seat. Every year about this time a jumble of memories from this period of years past goes through my mind. And a common refrain we hear from many people each year is "we can't believe it's the holiday season already." Yes, time seems to move faster as the years go by. But as we approach the beginning of the Advent Season, I want us to slow down a minute.

Remember Advent? Advent comes from a word which means "coming" or "visit". And during this season, we prepare for and anticipate the coming of Christ. We remember the longing of the Jews for a Messiah and our own longing for and need of forgiveness. We prepare to celebrate Christ's coming by lighting Advent Candles. We prepare by perhaps focusing our devotional time on what the coming of Jesus Christ meant for the world. We prepare with a whole host of activities such as decorating our homes, caroling, attending parties, sending cards, purchasing presents, and attending concerts and plays. But most of these latter events are more of a celebration than a preparation.

Advent begins four Sundays before Christmas (December 3 this year) and ends on Christmas Eve. The Sunday before Christmas (the 4th Sunday of Advent) is traditionally referred to as "Christmas Sunday". This year it all becomes a little blurred because the Sunday before Christmas is actually Christmas Eve and therefore the service that morning will take on a different feel perhaps than during those years when "Christmas Sunday" or the 4th Sunday of Advent is on say the 22nd or the 20th of December and there is a few day period between the two.

The color we use in the church on altars and pulpits is purple during Advent. It represents royalty and repentance. Blue is used in some churches and blue represents hope.

We live in a world that is always in need of hope. The coming of Jesus Christ brings hope.

As we prepare to celebrate his coming once again, let's spread some of that hope around by our actions and words. Let's bring hope instead of stress and while we are at it, love instead of hate, peace instead of conflict, and joy instead of sadness into the lives of everyone we come

into contact with. These themes of hope, love, peace, and joy are all part and partial of this Advent Season. Will we allow them to permeate our lives?



Attention Patrons of the Rossville Recycling center



Due to our building needs and revenue loss, the Town of Rossville has chosen to close the community recycling facility effective December 31, 2017. The Town will provide curbside recycling to <u>residential</u> customers within the corporation limits of Rossville. Beginning February 1, 2018, the trash portion of your utility bill will increase to \$11.50 per month.

Curbside recycling will begin January 10, 2018. Pick up will be the 2nd and 4th Wednesday of each month. Your recyclables will need to be out for pick up no later then 7:00 a.m. Place them where your trash is normally picked up. <u>Please leave your recyclables bagged in a clear plastic bag or covered garage can.</u> No regular trash will be picked up on this day. Don't leave loose items on the curbs as they will blow. All items can be combined in the same receptacle. They do not need to be separated. No electronics, styrofoam, yard waste, construction materials, liquids, appliances, dirt, rocks, cement, burnt ash, burn barrels, tires, batteries, or medical waste. Unacceptable items will be left.
