# **Annual Conference Review**

The 2019 session of the Indiana Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church met in Indianapolis on June 12<sup>th</sup> through the 15<sup>th</sup>. The theme of this year's conference was Water to Witness and focused on Ephesians 4:4-5.

Some of the highlights of the Conference involved the election of both clergy and lay delegates to the 2020 General Conference in Minneapolis as well as the 2020 North Central Jurisdictional Conference in Fort Wayne, at which new bishops are elected. Petitions to allow non -ordained local pastors to vote for General Conference Clergy delegates were approved and sent on to General Conference. Among the other highlights were the following:



**25** hours during the Annual Conference Session were spent with Rev. Kristine Marshall painting the mural depicted above, symbolizing this year's theme, "From Water to Witness."

**\$7671.40** was raised for the Missional Offering which was divided among the Lucille Raines residence for those recovering from substance abuse and Brianna's Hope, a ministry dedicated to assist people overcome opioid addiction.

1,100 blankets were donated to A Better Life - Brianna's Hope.

**9** individuals were commissioned into ministry as Provisional Elder—those on the path towards full ordination.

**16** individuals were ordained into the order of Elder or Deacon. (Fully ordained pastors)

69 clergy members entered into retirement.

**56** clergy and spouses who passed away this last year and entered into the Church Triumphant were remembered.

**The 2020 Indiana Annual Conference Budget** of \$12.8 million was approved. This is a 1% decrease over the 2019 budget.

Next year's annual conference is scheduled for June 11<sup>th</sup>-14<sup>th</sup> at Indiana Wesleyan University in Marion, IN.
