Imagine car horns honking, hundreds of people walking up and down sidewalks, musicians performing, trains coming and going, traffic stopping and starting, and all of this surrounded by a plethora of astounding architecture, tremendous art work on the sides of buildings, and some of the tallest buildings in the United States.

Stop.

Now imagine barely any sound at all except for a gentle breeze rustling through the trees, some birds singing and once in a while a person walking by.

Both of these instances describe the vacation Ruth and I took in late July. The first account is some of our experience during the three days and two nights we spent in Chicago. Thousands of people cheering at a baseball game and also my ride on the el from the hotel to the ballpark should be added to this. The second account is some of our experience during the four days and three nights we spent in northern Michigan at a cabin.

These experiences had very little in common. But Ruth and I thoroughly enjoyed each one. I can't even begin to explain the peace which was with us at the cabin in Michigan. Sitting on the screen porch doing morning devotions with no sound other than the sounds of nature can help a person connect with God more so than usual especially if such surroundings are not part of one's normal life. Even living in a small town such as Rossville rarely ever produces such tranquility unless I were to get up at two in the morning when there is very little traffic going by our house. On the other hand, there was something completely exhilarating being in the city and watching people from all walks of life going about their daily lives. Often times when I get in such crowds, I am humbled to think that God knows everything about every person I am encountering whether any of them recognize God or not. And, that God created each person. I share all of this not just to tell everyone about our vacation, but to help us to recognize that God has created places and experiences which are often completely the opposite of one another, and God is in every place. Whether the place is filled with thousands of people on one hand, or almost totally deserted of people on the other, God is there.

Let's consider this for a minute when we think about worship. For me, in the same way that I can enjoy the activity of a large city or metropolitan area as well as quiet and serene locales, I experience God in different styles of worship. I am able to worship God in services with modern music, clapping, raising hands, and people shouting amen on one hand, as well as in a quiet service with very little if any of the aforementioned. Hymns are sung. Prayers are prayed. The Word is preached. The service is relatively calm and serene. We see this differences in the Bible too.

A few Scriptures come to mind immediately. Both from the Psalms. One is from Psalm 150:3-5 which among other things encourages us to praise God with the sounding of a trumpet, with a harp, with dancing, with stringed instruments and pipe, with the clash of cymbals, and in fact with loud, resounding cymbals. "Let everything that has breath praise the Lord", verse six says. This certainly describes an energetic kind of worship.

Yet, when we go back to Psalm 46:10. We are commanded by the Lord to "be still, and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth".

I suppose one could write a book highlighting the many places throughout Scripture that describe different styles of worshiping God.

When we were in Michigan and I was sitting in the cabin or even going on a walk through the woods, I was able to "be still and know that the Lord is God." When we were in Chicago, I could see God amongst all the activity and people.

God is both and. Life is both and. There are times when we are busy and scurrying around from one thing to the next, never able to slow down. Then there are other times when all is quiet and still. God is there. Both. And.

Let us never forget. Let us be aware. And let us never disparage one kind of experience while celebrating another and vice versa. God is present in all.
