From the Pastor

At the end of May, it will have been thirty years since I graduated from seminary and began serving in full-time pastoral ministry. In these thirty years, once in a while a church service was cancelled because of a snowstorm but that was it. And while at this time we are not meeting in person, Church is still being held. But now, in a mostly empty sanctuary as the COVID-19 limitations have taken affect.

Thankfully, there is technology available so that we can broadcast the service and sermon on Facebook. We hope also in the near future to make this available on You Tube as well. For those people who do not have access to those platforms, e-mail is available. There are still some who have no computer access, and the folks who have requested it, receive a copy in the mail.

To be rather frank here, this is really a **weird time**. Is it not? Sometimes it feels like one day we will wake up and tell everyone about this incredibly **strange dream** we had where a world-wide virus hit, thousands died, and almost everything closed down since there was no vaccination available to stop it. O wait. It wasn't a dream. **It's real**. And worse yet, it has ratcheted up right as we come upon Holy Week and Easter.

We should know however, that there is **nothing** that **can stop Holy Week** from happening. There is nothing that can stop the fact that Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey and the people shouted "Hosanna!" There is nothing that can stop the teachings our Lord gave early during that week. There is nothing that can stop the fact that Jesus sat at a dinner table with his disciples and **transformed the Passover feast** into a meal to remember his upcoming sacrifice. He would become the "sacrificial lamb." There is nothing that can stop the fact that **Jesus suffered** through a sham of a trial, severe beatings, and then being **nailed to a cross**. There is nothing that can stop the fact that Jesus **lay dead in a tomb**. And above all, there is nothing that can stop the fact that the **stone** covering that tomb **rolled away** and **Jesus rose again**. No, there is nothing that can stop any of this.

But still. It's different. As of now, it appears that none of the extra community wide services normally held during Holy week will happen.

Many are anxious. Many are uptight. Some are going stir-crazy and some have "cabin fever". But be encouraged. **These days will pass.**

Continue to pray for those on the front lines in health care. Pray for those who continue to make deliveries. Pray for those who have any kind of exposure to the public. Pray for those who have been infected, and for those whose loved ones have died as a result. Pray for an **end to the virus.**

In the meantime, God has led us as a church to establish some new ministries as a result of COVID-19. You will read of these elsewhere here in *The Echo* this month.

I hope each of us will spend some of the time we are at home remembering the events of Holy Week. Maybe since we are not as busy as normal, they will become more meaningful to you this year and in your life. May the blood of Christ which was shed for our sins be upon your life in the days ahead.
