Have you ever noticed? Have you ever noticed that at a concert of a big name recording artist, or at a Purdue football or basketball game, or at a Broadway style musical, or at some other large event there are certain similarities between the crowds? It matters not their personalities or their politics or whether they even believe in God. There are similarities. I came across these from a pastor who had attended a well-known musical at the Fox theater in Atlanta. I share these here because they really got my attention. Here is a list of some of the similarities he noticed.

They:

- Paid large sums for premium tickets.
- Saved the date and prioritized their attendance.
- Arrived an hour before the event started.
- Parked blocks away and walked to the entrance.
- Waited in long lines to enter the building.
- Took their seats before the opening number.
- Remained silent and attentive throughout the performance.
- Sat in uncomfortable seats for over three hours.
- Envied those who sat closest to the stage.
- Took selfies to share on social media.
- Bought merchandise to proudly advertise their presence.
- Talked to family and friends about the experience.

I have attended several events over the years for which these attributes are common whether it was a baseball game, a musical in Chicago, and even concerts for well known Christian entertainers such as Amy Grant, Michael W. Smith, Casting Crowns, toby Mac, and others. However, one doesn't observe this in a typical Sunday morning worship service. Do we?

Maybe this is because attending a concert or a sporting event is not usually a normal occurrence. People plan for it in advance. Whereas worship happens every week and with the exception of a few holidays here and there, the services are generally the same style. And even the holiday services take on their own tradition-with the same music sung and the same Scriptures read year after year.

I wonder though. What would it take for people to get as excited about gathering to worship God in Christ and fellowship with others in the same manner that we would at a gathering with thousands of strangers at a sporting event or a concert? I wonder.


