What is freedom? How is freedom defined? We have come to a month of the year when we celebrate our freedom as a nation. But what does that freedom mean? Does it mean we are free to live out all of our wishes and desires regardless of whether they cause harm or not? Does it mean we can pretty much do what we want, and anyone who tells us otherwise is somehow inhibiting our freedom as human beings? In order for a society or organization or even the human race to flourish, don't there need to be some limits on 'freedom'? Don't there need to be some laws which protect us from each other? If there are no laws, there really is no freedom because then the freedom that prevails causes people to become entangled. And, there is anarchy.

The Bible describes this concept in such verses as 2 Peter 2:19 where it says, "These people promise them freedom, while they themselves are slaves of depravity—for a person is a slave to whatever has mastered them." In other words, there are people who are caught up in slavery to their own actions and desires. And yet, they have promised freedom to others. And all this does is drag people away from a state of freedom and into a state of slavery.

Yes, it is important to live in a "land of freedom", where we can move about mostly unrestricted. And we have freedom to worship. It gives us a choice to practice kindness, do no harm, and to stay in love with God. Freedom releases us from the chains of sin and allows us to be at peace.

Later in this chapter in Galatians, we are warned. "Do not use your freedom to indulge the sinful nature; rather serve one another in love."

So yeah. Celebrate the birthday of our nation's independence. Celebrate freedom. But at the same time be cognizant of those who were never able to experience this freedom even in the "land of the free". Remember there are many who have been held captive at different times and places throughout our history, and in some places this is still the case today.

Ultimately however, as much as humans try, there is no way we can offer or receive total freedom on our own. True freedom, true peace comes from the One who won our freedom from sin for each of us when he died on a cross- and then rose again.

May we remember from where our freedom truly comes. Jesus Christ.
