There are some people in this world who we could classify as sentimental types of folks. They have planned activities in their minds for every special day or holiday of the year. They have a list of holidays posted on the side of their refrigerator. Depending on the season of the year, their home, or office, or garage, or whatever is decorated to the hilt for whatever season it is. These might be the types of folks who have their homes all decorated for Fall even in late August, and they put their Christmas lights up the day after Hallow-een—which by the way, they had decorated for in early September. Birthdays, anniversaries, and even the marking of important events are all part of who they are. These folks cry at movies and are emotional over seeing a simple puppy in someone's arms. Many people have traces of these characteristics, but perhaps not all of these. At least not to an extreme.

Extreme examples of sentimentality are the folks who not only do not forget anniversaries, but plan for them well in advance. Overly-sentimental types of folks keep the greeting card industry in business and the Hall-mark Channel on the air.

Most people who know me well, would classify me as sentimental-but not to the extreme as I have described here.

In this vein, I was thinking about the fact that school in Rossville starts on August 5th this year. Once I get past my yearly complaints about school starting in almost the middle of summer, I refocus and some years I remember back to the beginning of many school years when I was a kid. It's the sentimental part of me which still remembers these kind of details.

I think the Bible is a pretty sentimental book in some respects. Think of all the details that are given in how to celebrate certain festivals and holidays-especially in the Old Testament. Think of the wording used to describe events such as Joseph meeting his brothers after he had become second in the land to Pharoah; the birth of Moses; the crossing of the Red Sea; the songs of David; the birth of Christ, the resurrection of Christ; the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost; and the predicted return of Christ to name a few. These aren't just some sort of monotone report on these events, but they are told in such a way that even children can remember them. Remember, the people were commanded to "Teach these to their children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up." (Deut. 6:7)

In so doing the importance of the Holy Scriptures are spread. The thought occurs to me, and it is really an indictment as I think about it. "Did I spend as much time teaching the Scriptures to my children as I did engraining in them an appreciation for holidays and seasons?" "Did I see to it that even if I wasn't the one teaching them, that they were regularly attending Sunday School or Jr Church or youth group as they got older?" Many churches, including ours, only have Jr Church these days because of the lack of children and youth. Families are all doing other things that are deemed more important. My question to myself and all of us is this. Are we as sentimental about the words taught us from the Bible as we are about everything else in life? And do we make an attempt to live them out?

Maybe we should ask God to show us where we have lacked and guide us in this area and to where God would like us to be in reaching everyone with the good news of Christ.
