Dreams and Renewal

We hear a lot of talk these days about a desire to see a time of revival among the churches of North America. Some folks are rather forceful in their declarations about this desire to see people and churches awaken from their slumber in order to reach a world which seems to be on a slippery slope. Everyday is another reminder of how little influence the

Christian faith seems to have on our culture, and in some cases, even on our churches. And therefore, many people speak of the need for a spiritual awakening, a time of revival and renewal to come to our churches and church-related organizations. But I wonder.

What does "revival" really look like? Is it a series of services where we gather together and sing some of the old hymns and gospel songs and bring in a preacher from out of town who will challenge us and hopefully create a deeper yearning for Christ? Is it a time when suddenly there are new converts to Christianity in a manner which people think used to be the case even though maybe it hasn't been the case for 50 years? I heard a comment made at a spiritual renewal retreat I attended recently which was so profound that I feel the need to share it here.

A pastor in attendance at this retreat observed that "revival is not a time of going back and restoring what was past, but it is a time or renewal in order to move forward into where God is leading us."

Basically, revival is a time of renewal. It is a time of being part of the movement of God as we experience evidence of Isaiah 43:18-19 where God says, "Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?"

All of this got me to thinking. In our desire for revival or renewal are we hoping it will be like we perceived that it was in previous years? Go to most churches which have existed for more than fifty years, and people will recount to you how it was when there were more families and children and young people. They will tell you about the ministries they used to be involved in.

They wax eloquent about everything that once was. And this is ok. But I wonder, do we think that some kind of a revival will restore what we think church was like in those days? Or do we think that a revival is one last chance to grasp on to the past before it is gone for good? But God tells us to "forget the former things... see, I AM DOING A NEW THING!"

Maybe we should be praying that God would reveal to us the dreams God wants for Rossville. Maybe its time for us to realize that while yes, the culture continues to grow further and further away from God, that God is not finished with us yet. What dreams does God want to reveal to us? How does God want to use these dreams to renew us? As we move into the last three months of 2022, isn't it time to open our eyes, our ears, and our hearts and begin to seek what God desires for us and for the surrounding community?

Therefore, lets dream some dreams! Let's open our hearts to renewal. Who knows what God has in store?
