A new year has arrived. 2023. Many people approach the year with a sense of joy at the possibilities of what could lie ahead. Many folks face 2023 with a sense of excitement because it is a milestone year in their lives. They will graduate from high school or college or tech school. Some people are expecting a new baby. And for others, 2023 is the year of their retirement. They've planned it for years and now it is here.

Others approach the year with a huge sense of relief. They are glad to see 2022 fall into the history books. 2022 was perhaps the worst year they'd ever experienced, and now they can refer to it as "last year".

Each new year is also a chance to make new goals and determine ways to meet those goals instead of giving up on them in the first few weeks.

Here at Rossville United Methodist Church, God has led us to a new emphasis on prayer and spiritual growth here in 2023. Many of these seeds were planted back in the fall as a group of us worked through a Bible Study which focused on periods of growth in Christianity evidenced by "signs and wonders". Starting the Sunday after New Year's and going up through the Sunday before Lent, I will be preaching and teaching about some of the "signs and wonders" which Christ did as are reported in the gospel of John and how people responded to them. Throughout the year, we will look at examples of breakthrough prayer and how these have impacted many churches and can impact our church here at Rossville. All of this will happen against a backdrop of a period of discernment in relationship to where we as a church feel God leading us in regard to our denominational status. Is God directing us as a local church to remain part of The United Methodist Church? Will we join a conservative denomination such as The Global Methodist Church? Or will we become an independent church not affiliated with any denomination? An article about the discernment process we have developed here at Rossville is included elsewhere in this issue of *The Echo*.

I believe it is pertinent that we move into all of this with breakthrough prayer, a study on signs and wonders, and spiritual growth as our foundation. If we set these aside, or just think they are nothing more than nice sounding words, whatever process we follow otherwise will not have the results God desires for us here at Rossville. As we enter into our 192nd year of ministry here in Rossville, let us ground ourselves in prayer and discernment.

May our prayer be this one which our prayer coordinator Vicki Rabanus shared with our Sunday evening prayer group recently. This prayer was written by Sue Nilson Kibbey. May it be our prayer for Rossville UMC and for our own lives as 2023 begins.

"God, may your preferred will break through, change history, usher in and accomplish through us your new hopes, dreams and possibilities-both in the life of our church, and in our own lives. We surrender our wills for yours, in order to fully follow you." Amen.



Rossville United Methodist Church Discernment Process

Listed below is a detailed description of the discernment process we will be following here at Rossville United Methodist Church as we consider where God is leading us in the future. Important dates mentioned in this are as follows:

Tuesday, January 24th7:00 pmTown Hall Meeting led by Superintendent Lore Blinn GibsonTuesday, February 7th7:00 pmPrayer Discernment sessionMonday, March 6th7:00 pmPrayer Discernment session

1. Christian discernment is, at its heart, an openness to the leading of the Holy Spirit guiding us in the truth of Jesus Christ. It is about being open to the living Word of God speaking to us in this moment.

"But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you." John 14:26

"I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth, for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come." John 16:12-13

Discernment involves quieting our own inner talk, cultivating a spirit of peace rather than anxiety or fear. The Bible says, "There is no fear in love, but perfect love drives out fear." (1 John 4:18) For a biblical example of the early church doing discernment work addressing a major contentious issue turn to Acts 11:1-18 and Acts 15:1-21.

2. In the 45 days following the Town Hall Meeting with Conference Superintendent Lore Blinn Gibson on January 24, 2023, a series of two prayer sessions shall be organized.

(Tentative dates for these prayer meetings would be Tuesday, February 7, 2023 and Monday March 6, 2023)

3. Each session will begin with the reading of this passage from *Colossians 3:12-15:*

"Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful."

- Begin each session with prayer; regularly stop throughout for more prayer.
- Ask: In light of this moment, how does this passage in Colossians speak to your hearts?
- Listen to one another respectfully expect the Holy Spirit will speak through the room.
- Identify what those in the room hear the Holy Spirit saying.

• Remind everyone to remain in prayerful conversation with the Lord, reflecting on Colossians 3:12-15, praying with others throughout as the Lord directs.

4. The prayer meetings shall include information about the legalities and all the steps needed if we were to disaffiliate. After each point is presented, we will follow the prayer process listed above. They will also present three different models of what the Rossville Church may look like in 3 years if we a)Remain a United Methodist Church b) Join the Global Methodist Church c) Become an independent church not affiliated with any denomination.

5. Schedule a final straw poll to determine direction in the future and next steps (two-thirds vote required).

6. Schedule final vote with Conference Superintendent (if it is determined that God is leading us in a direction of disaffiliation).

Administrative Council Approves 2023 Budget

Our Administrative Council approved the 2023 budget at its December 12, 2022 meeting. The budget reflects additions of 2 staff members during 2022 as well as rising costs for utilities and other areas. Therefore an overall increase of 13.9% was approved. When divided by our membership, this comes to an increase of \$4.60 per week per member.

We will by God's grace and the faithful stewardship of our members and constituents be able to meet the weekly expenditures of God's church here in our part of Rossville in 2023 as we continue to minister for Christ.
