Foundation. Do you ever think much about foundation? You know, that upon which everything else is built? Whether a simple slab for a one story home without a basement, or a skyscraper such as the Willis (formerly Sears) Tower in Chicago which has a 100 foot foundation and 90 interlocking tubes.

Everything has a foundation of sorts. Whether the roots of a tree or the DNA of humans and other living beings, there are major pieces which hold everything in place. Without a foundation, rarely anything would exist, or be able to hold together.



However, in time, through aging and the passage of time, or through poor decisions which might eat away at a foundation, even the strongest foundations may eventually crumble, thus causing whatever it is supporting to collapse.

The Bible speaks to us about foundations. These foundations are spiritual in nature and are able to withstand much.

They contain promise and hope. One such example is a prophecy from Isaiah about the Messiah. Isaiah 28:16 reads, "This is what the Sovereign Lord says: 'See, I lay in Zion, a tested stone, a precious cornerstone for a sure foundation; the one who trusts will never be dismayed." If we trust in Christ as our sure foundation, despite no matter how low we may become, or whatever life throws at us, we can endure. 1 Corinthians 3:11 exclaims that "no one can lay any foundation other than what has already been laid, which is Jesus Christ." Our lives are ultimately tested by the kinds of stuff we tried to build upon the foundation. Verse 13 says that the quality of each person's work is put to the test with fire, and that which survives is our reward. If everything is burned up, the person is still saved but only as one escaping through the fire.

Therefore, no matter what we try to build upon in our lives, the only foundation which is solid and lasting is Jesus Christ himself. Similarly, 2 Timothy 3:19 says that God's solid foundation stands firm, sealed with this inscription: "The Lord knows those who are his, and everyone who confesses the name of the Lord must turn away from sin."

Can we do any of this on our own merit? No. Only when we seek the strength which God offers us can we stand up against anything that would come at us in an attempt to drag us away from the faith.

It appears to me that much of the solid foundation which was built up by generations of Christ-followers who came before us is being tested these days. There is so much uncertainty, strife, and division that it appears many people have forgotten where their true foundation lies. Let us, as we move through this time of discernment here at Rossville, and as we live our lives out in the world, remember to stay connected to the solid foundation. Remember as the old hymn of the church says, "The Church's one foundation is Jesus Christ her Lord... with his own blood he bought her, and for her life he died."

As we prayerfully consider the future of the church here in Rossville, do NOT forget the foundation upon which we are built. The foundation of Jesus Christ who paid for all of us with his blood.


