FROM THE The amount of ink spilled over the past few years highlighting the divisions evident seemingly at all levels of life and society has become tiresome. And yet, we seem to eagerly soak up articles, social media posts, books, podcasts, programs, and even movies whose goals appear to want to keep the divisions flaring. However, when one thinks back through history, it becomes apparent that none of this is new. Division, strife, and disagreement have existed it seems since the days of Cain and Abel.

Each generation is convinced that things have "never been as bad as they are now." And we harken back to how it seemed people got a long better and had more respect for those with opposing viewpoints "back in the day" then they do now.

When Jesus was on this earth, he looked out over the crowds gathered on the day we refer to as Palm Sunday and wept. And he cried out, "if only you knew the things that make for peace."

He saw a people who were like a bunch of busy bees trying to make a go of it in the world but never succeeding. They knew nothing of peace. They lived in a land of oppression and hoped for a Messiah who would overthrow the Roman government and restore the land to the Jewish people. Jesus spent much of his ministry confronting these kinds of attitudes, teaching people where true peace comes from.

This Lent we are looking at some examples of how Jesus waged peace throughout Holy Week.

We begin with the first day of Holy Week where we realize that Jesus used his triumphal entry to subtly declare that he was not the Hammer of God. Instead, he was the Lamb of God and he calls his followers to embrace the way of this "lamb" who would sacrifice his life for us.

As we move throughout the season, we discover that after Jesus cleansed the temple, the money changers and animal sellers went out while the blind and the lame came in and were healed. Everything belongs to God, even those things we think belong to "Caesar". We will consider if we have chosen to follow the rabble rouser Jesus for peace, or are we more comfortable with the status quo instead? Lent often leads to a reevaluation of where we are in our relationship with Christ and one of the areas includes a comparison with Jesus' disciples. At the start, they left everything to follow Jesus. But by the end of the day on Holy Thursday, one of them leaves everything behind to stop following Jesus. What would we have done? When we come towards the end of the Lenten Season, we will discover that the peace Christ brings to our soul because of the cross brings forgiveness that has the ability to create a future at a time when it seemed like no future was possible. (Reiterating our verse of the year at Rossville: "See, I am doing a new thing.: Isaiah 43:19) And finally, on the day of the resurrection as Easter arrives, we will wrap it all up by realizing that God's great cleanup of a world of sin, violence, and injustice has begun.

I hope you will join together with us throughout this most holy season to grow, to learn, to allow our understanding of Christ to be stretched and deepened, and to realize that no matter what divisions are apparent in the world, in our communities, in our families, or even in our own life, that the One who came to bring peace to all of these is standing there as he did at Jerusalem so long ago and offering us the way that leads to peace.
