We are known as a church which prays. People know they can communicate a prayer concern to us, and someone will pray for it. Besides our prayer group, our automated phone tree, and even some text messages, we even have two places in the church building (one in the fellowship hall, and the other in the prayer corner at the back of the sanctuary) where people can write down a prayer request and place it in the basket which is there. We are good at praying for a whole host of needs, and we have seen many answered prayers over the years.


But, do we pray for each other? Are all the people in our congregation being prayed for regardless of whether or not they have expressed a need? Personally, when I first started at Rossville, I divided the congregation into groups of about 7 individuals or families each. Besides other requests I am aware of, I pray for one group each day. It takes about 2 or 3 weeks to pray through the entire congregation. But what about the congregation praying for each other?

Well, we are blessed to have an insightful prayer coordinator here at Rossville. She is leading us through a study on breakthrough prayer. One item which has come from this at the outset is that beginning **Monday May 1**st, everyone in the congregation is invited to open up the church directory to the page which includes their name and pray for each name listed on that page. If you don't have a directory, pick one up at church, or email us and we will get one to you. Once you have prayed for the people on your page, then turn to the next page on the following day and pray for the name of the people on that page, and so on. Soon, you will have prayed for everyone in the church. There will be names of people you don't know. There will be names of folks you haven't seen for maybe a period of years. Regardless. Pray for them. Lift them up and whatever they might be facing in their lives. This practice will help all of us go deeper and grow deeper in our prayer lives.

It might even lead to a breakthrough you didn't know you needed. Let us pray for one another. Who knows what God has in store for us and the people who currently are involved in Rossville UMC? Who knows what God has in store for the folks in our community that will one day be a part of our church but don't know it yet?

Remember, God is doing a new thing! Do you perceive it?
