From the Pastor

I was reading an article the other day about widespread drought conditions throughout Central Indiana. In the article, they indicated that not only have we had a dry period this summer, but the generally dry conditions extend all the way back to the end of last summer.

Besides the dry weather in our land which effects not just crops, but gardens, flowers, trees, lawns, and even animals, one might look at our culture-our society and determine that we are living in a dry and weary time. I could name all kinds of statistics and situations which would bear this out, but I believe each of us are aware of most of these whether it is a decline in morality, a dearth of church involvement, family stress, and a certain self-centeredness which appears to have taken over the national conversation.

Yet, the experiences of our day and time are not new. In Psalm 63, David cries out,

"O God, you are my God; earnestly I seek you; my soul thirsts for you; my flesh faints for you, as in a dry and weary land, where there is no water."

David would have known first hand about such an experience. In fact, when people from our part of the world visit the Holy Land, they are surprised by how much of a dry, barren and rugged wasteland it is in comparison with our part of the world.

In the case of Psalm 63, David compared the condition of his soul and flesh with the dry and weary land in which he lived.

His soul was parched. He spirit was dry. He was fainting. Where did he turn? Did he hide in himself? Did he use his experience as a reason to withdraw from everything? From God? No. Instead, he cried out to God. Who did David say his soul thirsts after? God! His flesh faints after God. He seeks the Lord even in the midst of sorrow. He leans upon God even though it feels like his heart and his flesh are grasping.

Just like weather patterns never remain the same, (Eventually we will be concerned because we've had too much rain.) our lives are not always at the point of drought. We are not always discouraged and looking around as if in a dry and weary land, wondering if anything will ever be "normal" again.

Therefore, when faced with times of spiritual, emotional, and physical drought in our lives, let us earnestly seek God. Let us hold on with all the strength God gives us knowing that the best days lie ahead.


