From the Pastor

Depending on when you read this, 2024 will be just hours away, or will have already arrived. It blows my mind to read those words. For many folks, the fact that 2024 is already here (or about to be) reminds us just how fast time is flying by. Anyone over 40 might remember when the year 2000 was years into the future. And now, here it is 24 years ago.

As 2024 approaches, many people are somewhat anxious about what the new year will hold. On the world and national scene, will the war in Israel or the war in Ukraine spread to something larger? Will another world war break out? Or has it already? Will we know a year from now who will be inaugurated president on January 20, 2025, or will there be another contested result? What kinds of decisions will be made at the 2024 UMC General Conference? How will these affect our congregation? These and multiple other questions might or might not be background noise for all the problems and concerns people face in their personal lives. And besides, its not all doom and gloom.

There is as much to look forward to as in any year. Seasons will change. Spring, Summer, and Fall will take their turns after the current winter is complete. Some folks are expecting babies. Others will get married. Others will graduate from high school, or earn a college degree. Many will start new jobs. Some will move to a new home. Life goes on despite whatever trials or difficulties any year might bring. Each year brings its own sets of challenges and victories. I would imagine 2024 will mirror previous years in this vein.

As followers of Jesus Christ though, it is important as we enter a new year to stop and reflect. During the church year, a time of spiritual-reflection is encouraged during Lent, (which this year begins on February 14th). But, at the same time it is as common, if not more so, for folks to do this reflection at the beginning of a year. For many, the setting of goals is important in this reflection process. I encourage this practice. I like the term goals rather than resolutions. Resolutions might be forgotten in days. But goals are something we can measure and work on. And then when we come to the end of the year we can evaluate where we are in the accomplishment of those goals (or not).

I am including a list here to help spur on your mind in this area. This is not an exhaustive list by any means. But I hope it gets your mind going. Whichever, my hope for each of you and for our church at Rossville here in 2024 is a year of blessing and growth in and through the Savior.

Here are some ideas for spiritual goals in 2024.

- -- Make daily prayer a habit.
- --Read the Bible. Allocate a few minutes each day to read several verses in the Bible.
- -- Actively take part in church services--physically, mentally, and spiritually.
- -- Keep a spiritual journal. Or, write down something you were thankful for from the day before.
- --Practice forgiveness. Forgiving someone who has wronged you will not only heal relationships. It will give you peace of mind, too.
- --Give back. Doing charity should not only be confined to Christmas and Thanksgiving. Giving back should be done all year round. Strive to be a blessing to others every single day. You can start by volunteering at a soup kitchen or donating your old clothes to people experiencing poverty.
- --As you pray, converse with God daily. Find a few minutes each day to spend alone with God. Tell him about the things you're thankful for this day as well as the things that you're worried about. Talk to him as you would a friend. These are just a few ideas to jump-start your mind. I hope you will take them as the encouragement that they are.

2024 Rossville United Methodist Budget

The Rossville Administrative Council approved a 2024 budget which totals \$135,494.96. This is a 6.7% DECREASE, or \$9,590.50 LESS than 2023. Many costs increased in 2023 and we operated at a deficit through most of the entire year. Your Finance committee, with final approval given by the Administrative Council, worked prayerfully and diligently to restructure and find savings in several areas of the budget in order to bring it closer in line with the monies which come through our offerings. The weekly budget need for 2024 is \$2,656.73. Please prayerfully consider how you can help to give to the ministry of Rossville UMC in this new year.
